Number 1: Make sure that when you leave the classroom, the lights are turned off. This could be at breaktimes, lunch times, assemblies or at the end of the day!

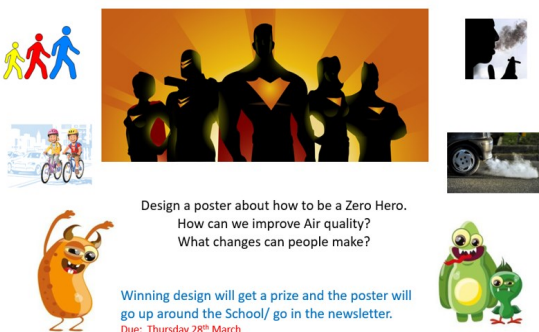
Number 2: Try to have the lights off even when you are in the room. Sometimes natural light is enough!

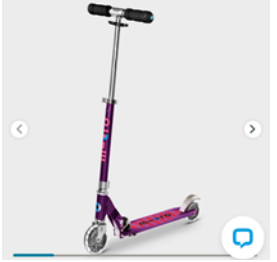
