South America is made up of 14 countries of which Brazil is the largest.

South America is surrounded by the Atlantic Ocean to the East and the Pacific Ocean to the West.



Brazil lies between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn so has a tropical climate with a dry season and a wet season.



Brazil has diverse natural habitats including the Amazon rainforest and the Amazon River (the second longest river in the world).
