Co-opted governor

Latchmere School is undertaking a recruitment search for a new co-opted governor to join our Local Governing Body. Co-opted governors are volunteers and very valuable members of our governing body. Our governors have a variety of skills and experience, and our governing body includes the Headteacher, other members of staff, parents and people from our local community.

The role of the governing body, together with the Headteacher and the Trust, is to set the future direction of the school and oversee and monitor the implementation of its strategic development. The governing body makes decisions on issues such as performance targets, school policies and the school development plan.

Latchmere School is a multicultural and inclusive school and is looking for candidates from diverse backgrounds. There are no specific skills required, with training being provided as part of the role. Latchmere School is part of a two-school Trust, and the Trust is well supported by a wonderful community of dedicated staff, senior leadership and devoted parents. The Trust aims to deliver an outstanding primary curriculum, backed with exceptional teaching and learning for all children in the care of the Trust.

Time commitment

The successful candidate will join the Local Governing Body and participate in the 6 meetings each academic year, on every half term. Meetings typically last 1.5hrs with a couple of hours spent reviewing papers and preparing questions ahead of the meetings. Governors also commit to carrying out school visits and undertaking training each year to develop their governance skills.
