Key people, facts and sticky knowledge

The earliest Maya settlements in central Mexico date to around 1800BC. They were **agricultural**, growing crops such as corn (maize), beans, squash and cassava.

Mayan society was formed of a number of city states each with their own ruler: El Mirador, Tikal and Chichen Itza for example. These cities were designed in a similar pattern: palace, plaza and pyramids.

The Maya were the only civilisation in the Americas, and only one of five cultures in the world to develop a fully-fledged writing system.

The Maya were expert mathematicians and astronomers. They used this expertise to make calendars.

The Maya worshipped many gods and performed ceremonies to keep them happy. Mayan gods could change themselves into human and animal shapes

By the end of this period of learning, pupils should be able to describe aspects of the Mayan era drawing on their knowledge of civilisation and their way of life. They will know what caused the decline of the Maya.
