Casian: "I liked wearing red, and some of my friends had a shield and a sword."



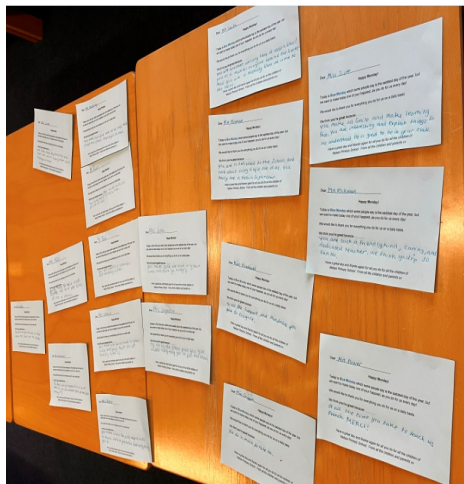
Parent Rep Meetings

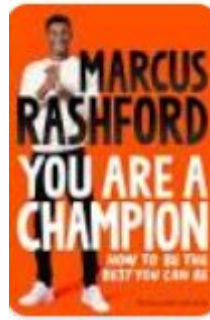
