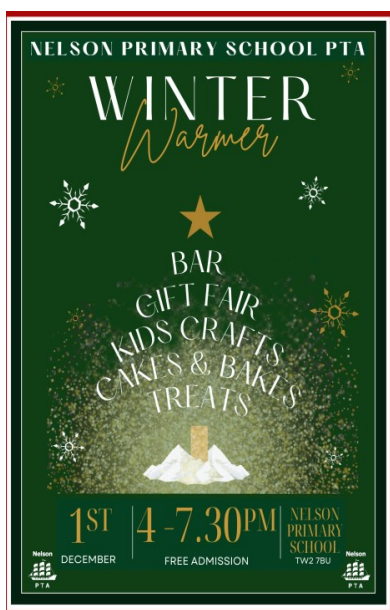
SILENT DISCO
