Key people, facts and sticky knowledge

A **century** is 100 years. Most of our grandparents and parents were born in the 20th Century and they were born in the 21st century.

Games and toys have changed over time. Some traditional games are still played today: hopscotch, marbles, skipping, hand clapping. Toys were mainly made of wood, paper and metal during the Victorian age.

Queen Victoria lived from 1819 – 1903. She became Queen in 1837. Victorian children played with toys such as the spinning top, cup and ball, cloth peg doll and paper windmills.

By the end of this period of learning, pupils should be able to describe games from the past and compare them to games they play now. They will understand their family history by explaining their family tree.
