Key concepts, facts and sticky knowledge

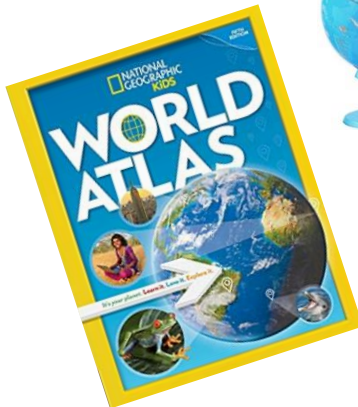
There are **7 Continents** in the world- Europe, Asia, Australia, Africa, Antarctica, North America and South America.
