As, always the true stars of the show were the pupils who the inspectors spoke highly of, their natural ability to articulate their learning, talk about the exciting events and activities that take place each week and how they feel safe and are looked after at the school. The school was described by many pupils as a family.

We know that this recent inspection is only another part of the journey, and we will collectively work together, as we have been, to ensure that Nelson continues to refine, improve and develop, to achieved the best that they can for all the pupils who walk through our gates.
