coast	Where the sea meets the coast.
beach	A sandy or pebbly shore by the sea
pier	A raised platform supported by pillars that rises above the water and just out from its shores.
Amusement arcades	An indoor area containing coin-operated game machines.
promenade	A paved public walk along the seafront.
railways	A network of tracks for trains to travel on.
airports	A large area where airplanes can land and take off.
ports	A place where ships load and unload people or cargo.
holidays	The word holiday comes from the words 'holy day' because a long time ago holidays were based around religious festivals
