#### **Anti Idling Campaign**

Our Safety Team met with Dr. Gia Pendred from the council to learn about travelling safely to school and the effects pollution from cars have on our lungs. We learnt that when there are high levels of pollution it affects children with asthma. Dr. Gia was impressed with the amount of families walking to school on such a cold day but she also noticed the families are not using the raised platform to cross the road outside of the school gates. The Safety Team will be taking this matter forward to promote crossing the road safely.

#### P.E

As part of our P.E curriculum, all children will take part in gymnastics, yoga and dance. During their lessons, children need to either be bare-footed or must wear plimsoles/indoor shoes (shoes that have never been used outside). Most gym lessons are taught using our gym mats and therefore being barefoot or wearing plimsoles are the safest options.

If your child doesn't like being barefooted, please may we ask you to bring in a pair of plimsoles/indoor shoes, which can be left in school. Unfortunately, outside trainers cannot be used during gym, yoga or dance.

#### **Reminders**

Please remember that our Nelson car park is for **staff only**.

The ship and trim trail are timetabled during the school day. For safety reasons children should not be using these before or afterschool.

Please do not ride your bikes/scooters across the playground or by the entrance.
